Preserve Your Heirlooms for Years to Come

Rapid City, S.D. – April 26, 2010 – Whether it is a quilt your grandmother made, a box of old photos, or silver passed down to you through several generations, we all have treasures we would like to have around for years to come. However, if not taken care of properly quilts fall apart, photos fade, silver tarnishes and many other treasures will be ruined. In celebration of Historic Preservation Month, the library is hosting a panel discussion on Thursday, May 6 at 6:30 p.m. for people to learn how to take care of these items as well as other heirlooms and collectibles.

The library's Community Voices Lecture series will feature a panel of local and state experts in the area of preservation. Members of the panel include Arlette Hanson, curator at the Adams Museum; Carolyn Weber, assistant director of the Adams Museum; Matthew Reitzel, manuscript archivist at the State Archives; and Dan Brosz, curator of collections at the Cultural Heritage Center.

The members will discuss their own work and how their expertise can be applied to the preservation of family heirlooms. In particular, Hanson will talk about caring for textiles, Weber will share how to preserve photographs, Reitzel will cover paper document preservation and Brosz will discuss caring for glass, stone, bone, metal, plastic and wood items as well as the importance of documenting collections.

This event takes place at the downtown library located at 610 Quincy Street. Cookies and
